



From the Pastor

Hello Southminster,

All my bags were packed, ready to leave on a jet plane knowing that I would not be back again. Retirement from the Ministry was set for August 31, 2022. Retirement as in retirement. Done. Finished. History.

On Sunday 31 July 2022, I unpacked my bags and my being in the two-windowed corner office at Southminster, which I have the privilege to call my second home for the past year and shall for another year.

What happened? Why was I back in the Ministry before I even retired? I believe God is the culprit. He made me see something. As I approached the church complex from Hull Street. I saw something. When the Interim Pastor Nominating Committee and I talked, I saw something.

Michelangelo was once observed pushing a huge rock through the streets of Florence. The bemused citizens turned to him to ask, “Why are you pushing that mighty rock, Michelangelo?” His response was simple but decisive: “Because there’s is a person inside longing to come out!”

I saw and heard a faith community longing to come out.

God’s future for a congregation is not in introducing a plan or a strategy; it is among the people of God. God brings the future towards us. God’s future is cultivated in the community among the ordinaries of one another.

A faith community’s longings becomes God’s future for them when God’s people shift their attention to elements such as listening to Scripture; dialoguing with one another, learning to listen and coming aware of and understanding what is happening in their neighborhoods, community and the places of their everyday lives. Instead of seeing these places and relationships as potential for church growth (numbers), they come to see it as places where God’s Spirit is present and calling us to enter with listening and all-inclusive love.

This shift sees God at work in one’s context and seeks to name what God might be up to. It is about seeing the church in, with, and among the people and places where we live, rather than in a building with a certain kind of people.

I still see and hear a faith community longing to come out more and more. God’s future for Southminster is in and all around us. Let us “come out” together this year and embrace our God given future as a congregation.

Changes to Church Accounting

The Session has approved a change in how we handle our accounting. We are switching to a less expensive software program and employing an outside accountant part-time. This will assist our hardworking, volunteer Treasurer, Mark Endries. The net result is that the church will save a substantial amount each month. When implemented we plan to go back to reporting on what current spending is in various categories versus the budgeted amounts. We expect monthly information to be available in about two months.

Scholarship Committee Report

I am pleased to share the Scholarship Committee was able to provide generous scholarships to five of our college students. Merrill Dugger, Ryan Endries, Bella Paterson, Seth Willis and Jacob Wetzel received portions of \$28,043.22 made possible by the Zona Willis Estate and a special scholarship fund established by an anonymous donor. This is such a blessing for the students and their families.

To be eligible to receive a portion of this fund, you must be a confirmed member of the church. I encourage our youth members to speak with Rev. O'Connell about joining the church if you are not already a member. If anyone would like to contribute to the Scholarship Fund you may make designated contributions to the fund.

Stewardship Awareness: Food Closet

As of July 20th, our Food Closet has provided food for 209 families (a total of 746 individuals) for 2023. To date, Southminster has spent \$15,079.14 to fill in shortages in our Food Closet and to provide grocery cards so that our clients can purchase perishables.

Our Food Closet is supplied partly through our church budget, and partly through generous donations of food and money from our members, friends, neighbors, and community partners. We could not keep up this important work without your help. We are always happy to accept donations of nonperishable food items. Please remember that all food must be unopened and unexpired. Thank you so much for your ongoing generosity.

Stewardship Awareness: Liberation Veteran Services

Members were responsive in donating day-to-day household supplies for our mission to the Liberation Veterans Service" organization and the vets were most grateful. Thanks too for Rich Kowalski and Susan Pharr for transporting the supplies. Another stewardship opportunity is coming – providing school supplies or funds for special education students in the county. We continue to be a grateful and giving church!
