Dearest Soutminster

In 1985, on my first day at Seminary, I felt at home parking my 1972 Ford Escort amongst many same age and older cars. No flashy new cars in our parking area. My Escort? Well it was roadworthy. Great for getting from point A to B, but less good from A to Z. Applying the brake caused a medium amount of shudder and squealing from somewhere underfoot. The steering wheel? Well it was less exact. If you turned it, the Escort would eventually change direction. Not always the intended one. It took some skill to keep it on the road. Going into any turn at 60 miles per hour, a nightmare. At 70 miles per hour – only downhill – even on a straight road was a rollercoaster ride.

Reminded of my basic military training. Left, right, left right. The parade ground. The drill Sargent putting us through our marching paces. There was always one guy blessed with two left or right arms or feet!! You have seen it...when the left arm and leg are in sync but actually totally out of sync because they should not be in sync. Then it happened. One of our classmates was a “well off” older gentleman. He was a Chiropractor who had his own practice for many years and as a seminarian, still practiced his profession after class. I just looked at him. “How much did you pay for the Beemer?” He answered me. I just looked at him. You could buy a small house back then with that money. Said to him “You call that a driving experience? You could have borrowed my Escort and took on Piet’s Corner at 60 miles per hour. That is a driving experience!”


