Our Lenten Journey

When you receive this month's newsletter our faith community, and Christians everywhere, will have passed through most of the Lenten season which began on Ash Wednesday. At Southminster, we observed Ash Wednesday with a worship service. Toward the end of Lent we will observe Maundy Thursday with a worship service as well, which will take place on Thursday, April 14th in the evening.

The Lenten season is often referred to as a journey. We travel through Lent as both individual people and as a faith community. It is a journey that is characterized by self-examination and remembrance as we consider what it means to live faithfully as the people of God. It has been said by some that we can't get to Easter without going through Lent.

Lent is a season of waiting. It is a time for us to hit the "pause button" and do a "reality check" for forty days. During this time, we wait in anticipation of the coming of the other side of Lent, when we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ, on Easter Sunday.

Lent is a season of reflection. It is a season that calls us to be honest with ourselves and with our Creator as we prepare our hearts and minds for the mystery of the resurrection. It is a time to intentionally look back and think about our lives as we take stock of all that we are grateful for. It is a time to remember what we have learned from the past that will help us to live more faithfully as the people of God in the future.

Lent is a season of change. Often people choose to engage in some new activity during the season, perhaps joining in on a book study, or seeking to engage in some form of volunteer service. One common practice of this season is to give up something— perhaps a favorite food or a TV show—to live without it for a time. Others may decide to pray more regularly than usual or to make some other change in their personal lives.

Lent is also a season of rediscovery in God's infinite faithfulness and generosity to all people, even as the season calls us, as followers of Jesus Christ, to live more faithfully and generously in response.

Then when we get to Easter, having passed through Lent, we are renewed in our minds and spirits. We are ready to receive our Lord, Jesus Christ, anew singing "Alleluia!" May we all be renewed this Lenten season and blessed with joy as we enter the new season of Easter.

RISC Nehemiah Action

In his sermon on March 13, the Rev. Fred Holbrook praised Southminster for our work with "the least of these." RISC is one of the ways we serve thousands by advocating for affordable housing (and we have succeeded!), for gun violence intervention (we are not giving up, in spite of Mayor Stoney's attempts to ignore us), and for those whose mobile homes need repair or replacement (a new project we are addressing this year).

The Nehemiah Action is our annual gathering to present our programs to public officials. This year, it is IN PERSON! **We will meet at the church at 5:15pm on Tuesday, April 5, to carpool to the Richmond Convention Center,** where we hope to join over 2000 of our fellow RISC friends. Our goal is to send 65 from Southminster, so please join us! If you are immunocompromised, unvaccinated, or out of town, there is a Zoom option. The Convention Center holds 4000, so social distancing will be observed. Please call Shelley Murray to find out more.

Special Offering - One Great Hour of Sharing

In April, we will have the opportunity to contribute to this annual offering. The majority of the funds (90 %) will be used by the Presbyterian Church (PCUSA) for three missions: the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Program, the Presbyterian Hunger Program and the Self-Development of People Program. The remaining portion of your contribution will be used to assist our own Southminster Food Fund. In this time of Lent and Easter, please consider all we have been given and return a portion for these directed missions. We all have much to be thankful for.

Southminster Scholarship

The youth and young adults in our congregation have been blessed by the generosity of former and current members who contribute to our Scholarship Fund, helping our young members with college expenses. All eligible Southminster youth are encouraged to apply for the Southminster Scholarship.

Applicants must be confirmed members of Southminster and attend at least two worship services or churchsponsored events each year. (The Scholarship Committee will offer grace on the participation requirement due to the extraordinary circumstances of 2021.) Applications and guidelines will be available at the church and will also be mailed to eligible students. <u>Session Highlights</u>

- Approved new COVID protocols based on the updated information by CDC and the Virginia Department of Health. A weekly review of the COVID Community Levels will determine the wearing of masks at Southminster. Of course, at any time, one may choose to wear a mask, but we will adhere to the following levels:
 - LOW or green, masks optional
 - MEDIUM or yellow, wear masks entering and exiting church building and sanctuary, masks may be removed while in church pew.
 - HIGH or orange, masks worn at all times in church building.
- Chesterfield County is currently at a LOW level, on Sunday April 3rd, we will begin to implement this new policy.
- We will begin the process of removing the yellow tape, while exploring the best way to clean the pew cushions. This process may take some time so please be patient.
- It was also passed that we will begin collecting the regular offering during the worship beginning April 3rd.
- Motion not to have session meeting in April, and change the May meeting to the 22nd was passed.
- A motion to move the current Children's worship area to the back of the sanctuary and move the Bell Choir tables in its place was passed.
- Approved the Ministry Information Form for the Interim Pastor position.
- Approved a motion to set outdoor worship schedule as June 5th August 28 at 9am.
