## From the Pastor

"We can't all do great things, but we can do little things with great love." This quote, often attributed to Mother Theresa, was in fact written by a woman called Saint Therese of Lisieux, who was so inspirational to Mother Theresa that she chose to take on her name. St. Therese of Lisieux, also known as "the little flower" was quite a young woman. Although she died at just 24 years old, she soon became well known worldwide for her wisdom and teachings of the power of humility and small acts of devotion.

## **Christmas Joy Offering**

During this month, all members will have the opportunity to make a gift through this annual special offering. Collected funds are used in the Assistance Program by the Board of Pensions of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A) to help current and retired Presbyterian church workers and their families that have financial needs. During 2020 the Board of Pensions was able to help 299 households with needed supplemental income and 244 households to allow those folks to remain in their existing homes, or to afford assisted living or long-term care housing. In addition, a portion of your gifts will be used to help support Presbyterian-supported colleges that are equipping students of color that have financial needs and that have the goal of becoming future church leaders. This latter ministry has been active for nearly 140 years. During this season of giving, we all can participate in the Joy Offering at whatever level is personally viable while we celebrate the birth of the best gift the world has ever received – our Lord Jesus Christ.

## Last Minute Giving and Tax Planning Reminders

That end of the year is fast approaching, and now is the perfect time to make an end of year gift to Southminster. After all, how many organizations can you say you interact with every single week with opportunities for spiritual growth, fellowship, and care! End of year donations must be postmarked by December 31st.

Consider taking advantage of some end of year tax saving opportunities. For example:

- For 2021 even if you take the Standard Deduction you can take an additional \$300 deduction (\$600 married filing jointly) for charitable contributions.
- A portion of your Required Minimum Distribution (up to \$100,000) donated directly to a charitable organization like a church as a Qualified Charitable Distribution reduces your taxable income by the same amount even if you take the Standard Deduction!
- Appreciated stock donated directly to a charitable organization avoids Capital Gains Tax and could be advantageous especially if you itemize deductions.

As always, make sure you consult with your tax advisor!
