From the Pastor

"My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you." - John 15:12

Friends,

In the 15th chapter of John, Jesus is sharing his last words with his disciples, knowing that his time with them is drawing to a close. He reminds his disciples that he calls them his friends, therefore calling upon them to be good friends to one another, loving one another as he has loved them.

All of you should have received a letter from me earlier this week announcing that my last Sunday at Southminster will be March 6th after which I will transition to my new call as Designated Associate Pastor for Congregational Care, at Westminster Presbyterian Church in Dayton, Ohio. As I have been praying about this big change in both my life and the life of Southminster, I keep coming back to those words of Jesus' commanding us to love one another. Over the past eight years, I have addressed all of my newsletters and weekly emails to you with the word, "Friends." Every time I write it, I am thinking of Jesus' command for us to love one another with the same love of friendship that he first gave to us. Certainly, I'm not thinking of myself as Jesus! But I am thinking of myself as a disciple, just like you, who has received such life-changing love from God and been commanded to share it.

It has been a wonderful two-way friendship, in which I feel I have received just as much love and friendship from all of you as I could have ever possibly given. As I look to this coming month, I hope to prioritize spending time together, sharing in that friendship, and saying our goodbyes.

After March 6th, guided by the Presbytery of the James and many generations of pastoral wisdom, I will take a step back from being in regular communication with my Southminster friends. This is spiritually healthy for me, as it will allow me to focus on helping my family through this big transition and make a strong and faithful beginning in my new call. It is also healthy for Southminster, as it gives you space to discern where God is leading you next and do the good work of welcoming in your Interim Pastor. You are welcome to remain linked with me online, to follow photos of the girls and share well wishes. But the role of pastor in offering care and guidance, or performing duties like weddings, funerals, or baptisms will no longer be my place. I know that God has wonderful and gifted future leaders in store for you and I look forward to being able to cheer you on from afar.

More About Qualified Charitable Distributions

With a new giving and tax year beginning we feel it is appropriate to issue a reminder of the advantages of Qualified Charitable Distributions for those who are required to take a Required Minimum Distribution from an Individual Retirement Account. For IRA's held in Fidelity a QCD can be easily executed online without involving an agent. Other fund families have similar user-friendly procedures.

QCD Facts:

- QCD's reduce your taxable income by the amount of the QCD which is essentially equivalent to a tax deduction which can be important for taxpayers who can't itemize deductions due to the current high Standard Deduction.
- The maximum QCD per year is \$100,000 but with no minimum a number of small donations can be made.
- QCD's don't have be given all at once but can be set up as periodic donations such as monthly or quarterly.

As most of you know, we cook and deliver several meals each year to homeless veterans who are residents of the Liberation Veteran Services. As a non profit organization, LVS relies on the generosity of local churches and businesses to provide a wide array of services to Veterans in crisis.

This will be the 7th year for providing dinner meals to a group of approximately 30 men. Because of the pandemic, we have not been able to serve and fellowship in person. We keep hoping that will change soon, as those interactions are extremely rewarding and so much appreciated by the residents and staff and volunteers.

We always welcome additional volunteers who are interested in being a part of this successful mission. Typically, we begin our planning via email approximately 2 weeks ahead of the scheduled date. Planning includes selecting a menu and recruiting volunteers for one of several tasks! Depending on COVID protocols, you can volunteer to cook (at home or in the church kitchen), grocery shop, or transport and serve. There is something for everyone, and everyone's contribution, large or small, is greatly appreciated.
