

From the Pastor

Friends, as I am writing this, our state is officially opening vaccination appointments to anyone age 16 or older. I have been so grateful to hear so many of your stories of getting vaccinated and I am looking forward to more friends and family experiencing that same relief and gratitude!

With this new opening I want to extend an open invitation to anyone who needs help making an appointment or getting a ride to get in touch with me. I am happy to help get you protected!

As a faith leader I think a lot about making milestones in our lives and the prayers, rituals, and symbols that surround those turning points. When I think of any individual's faith journey I think of it as a series of milestones that we mark together as a faith community. I think first of baptism, that moment of celebrating a new life with water, song, and blessings. As our children grown in God we celebrate each milestone all the way to confirmation, and finally their Senior Youth Sunday when celebrate their graduation and send them into the world with our blessing. In our adult life we mark the beginning of relationships and families with a wedding ceremony. We mark years of service with ordination and installation prayers and the laying on of hands. We mark retirements, illnesses, and recoveries with prayers, cards, and special gifts. And of course, we mark the loss of our loved ones with the ritual of a funeral. Rituals help us make meaning from our life. Rituals help us say hello and goodbye. They give us comfort and closure. They give us space to process and release our emotions. Most of all, they remind us of the presence of God with us at every step in our journey.

So, I encourage you to mark this pandemic turning point with a small ritual for yourself. Whether you have long completed your vaccine or still have questions that you need to talk with your physician about- it is good to take a moment to reflect. Find a quiet place, maybe on your porch, at your kitchen table, or out on a walk. Light a candle or pour a cup of coffee and spend some time remembering all you have overcome in this year, and all the hopes you have going forward. It might be good to make a list or talk out loud to God about it. Then take some time to pray. You can use one of the prayers I've shared on page 5, or speak in your own words.

In this newsletter you will also find an invitation to continue that process of reflection alongside others in our Covid Conversations, as well as updates on opportunities for worship, fellowship, and service that are slowly returning, in large part because of the protection provided by the vaccine. I hope to be seeing more of you face to face over the next few months!

Church in the World

<u>RISC: Nehemiah Action Report</u>

The 2021 Nehemiah Action brought together some serious power, with around 2000 attending from all around Richmond, 700 more than our goal and a RISC record. Southminster had set a goal of 40 to attend and we outdid ourselves with 56! If you'd like to see a recording of the meeting, please visit YouTube and do a search for Nehemiah Action Assembly 2021.

We got some great press the next day, with an article in the *Times-Dispatch* and another on NBC12. For our Affordable Housing issue, Councilpersons Lynch and Jones publicly committed to champion our two "asks" for this year –

- \$10 million in the budget for the Affordable Housing Trust Fund
- Half of the dollars in the Trust Fund going toward the creation of units for households making 30% AMI and below

For our Gun Violence issue, Richmond Police Chief Smith did not fully commit to applying for the state funding to conduct the Problem Analysis (the necessary first step in implementing a proven, evidence-based gun violence intervention program). However, once the grant details are released (any day now), we plan to follow up with Chief Smith and are hopeful we can get him "to a yes" on this.

If anyone is interested in joining the RISC team at SPC, please let Shelley Murray or Rich Kowalski know. These issues are ongoing, and there are meetings every week (always on Zoom), so if you are passionate about making sure they are addressed, please let us know.

Finance

One Great Hour of Sharing

The One Great Hour of Sharing special offering was officially collected on Easter Sunday, April 4th, but to our extreme gratification we saw generous donations come in all through the month of April. We are **pleased to report that we collected \$1,055.00 for the One Great Hour of Sharing in 2021.** Donations are used domestically and globally by the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) for three outreach missions: hunger assistance, natural disaster relief, and self-development of people.

Hunger actions include helping with immediate needs and addressing chronic poverty and its effects. In disaster relief, both the physical and the emotional needs of affected persons are addressed. Self-development of people helps those experiencing oppression, injustice, and poverty and to educate all Presbyterians about how these experiences affect our brothers and sisters.
