### **Food Closet Update**

As of April 18th, our Food Closet has provided food for 103 families (a total of 357 individuals) for 2023. Our Food Closet is supplied partly though our church budget, and partly through generous donations of food and money from our members, friends, neighbors, and community partners.

For those of you who shop regularly you know how much the cost of food has gone up just since January. To date, Southminster has spent \$5,206.36 to fill in shortages in our Food Closet. We could not keep going without your help and the help of our partner churches who collect food on our behalf. We are also exceptionally grateful for the service of our volunteers who are drawn not only from Southminster's congregation, but from Lyndale Baptist and St. David's Episcopal Church. By working together we can make a huge difference in our community.

### **Southminster Scholarship**

The youth and young adults in our congregation have been blessed by the generosity of former and current members who contribute to our Scholarship Fund, helping our young members with college expenses. All eligible Southminster youth are encouraged to apply for the Southminster Scholarship.

Applicants must be confirmed members of Southminster and attend at least two worship services or church-sponsored events each year. Applications and guidelines will be available at the church. Applications are due by June 15, 2023.

### **Stewardship Awareness**

The Session has discussed a need we see for better communications with the congregation in certain areas. One of those areas is in our mutual participation in stewardship – both our individual resources and our volunteered time. Those matters are reviewed in our annual church meeting but a lot of information is reviewed quickly then because of the shortage of time. It has been proposed that smaller "pieces of all the facts" about our stewardship might be better understood in the form of regular, brief reviews in this monthly newsletter. This is the first of these planned bits of information. We hope you find them helpful in understanding the church's missions and routine expenditures.

This month two items in the approved budget are noted:

Our contribution to the Presbytery of the James for the various local, national and foreign missions and associated expenses - \$5,000 for the year or about \$417 per month.

Our total expenditures to pay our basic, building utility bills. Specifically, this is the total for electric power, water and sewer service and natural gas - \$23,500 for the year or about \$1,960 per month.

We are most grateful that our members are participating in the stewardship of their financial resources and volunteered time to continue our Lord's work here at Southminister. Thank you!

### **Disaster Relief Mission Trip ~ Coming in May**

Once again, I am putting a team together to help with the recovery from Hurricane Ian in Southern Florida. We have been to Little Gasparilla Island, Florida twice, and they were devastated. However, the damage also goes deep inland. This trip is being sponsored by the Presbytery of the James, with logistics and accounting provided by Southminster Presbyterian Church and myself, Brown Pearson. The dates are May 13th through May 21st, 2023. We are going inland this trip to Hardee County, FL to the town of Wauchula. It is a small community with much devastation and not much help so far.

As usual, we need able bodied people who can get in there and get to work. Any skill level is helpful at this point in time. These people will have been over 6 months and homes are still a mess. We are scheduled to be doing rebuild. I am looking forward to having a team of 24.

We have a place to stay with a kitchen. We will need to cook our own meals, so we can either get a volunteer to be our cook, or we can divide the job up. We will need our own air mattresses (or use their cots) and sleeping bags.

I promise you three things – 1. We will do manual labor (at your own pace) and you just might develop a skill you never thought you would have -2. You will have one of the most positive experiences of your lifetime -3. You will be making a huge difference in the lives of a number of very grateful people.
