Especially if your life seems relatively untouched at the moment, I hope you will see that as an opportunity to pray for those who are still running the race- our nurses, teachers, and so many other front line workers. Covid Updates

First, a huge thank you to all you for your faithfulness and patience in masking, distancing, and getting vaccinated over the past year! You all have consistently put the health and safety of your friends and neighbors first in such a Christlike way. All of us hoped that by this time of the year we would be eagerly lifting some of our remaining precautions. But unfortunately, the rise of the Delta variant with its increased contagion among vaccinated people has delayed that hope.

The session met on August 15th and voted to affirm our automatic closure policy based on local Covid testing rates. We passed that threshold on Thursday August 19th, marking the highest numbers we have seen since February. So, starting on Sunday August 29th all activities will be held either online or outdoors. We will offer two Sunday morning options, a 9am in-person worship service in the outdoor chapel, and a 11am live-streamed worship service in the sanctuary. Outdoor and online Sunday School classes will be available starting on Rally Day. Masks are required at all time inside the church building, following CDC guidelines. Masks are requested outdoors as we move in and out of the worship space but may be removed while seated at a safe distance. People who are not vaccinated or are working with unvaccinated children need to be masked at all times.

As frustrating as it is to feel like we are going backwards, we continue to keep our most vulnerable members in mind and are committed to making worship accessible to all.

Our Sunday School year will begin on Rally Day, September 12th!

Southminster Food Closet

Southminster's Food Closet is one of our congregation's oldest and most active mission and outreach programs, having been in consistent operation since the mid-1980s. In partnership with CCHASM (Chesterfield & Colonial Heights Alliance for Social Ministry) we provide a week's worth of groceries for up to eight families per week, effectively serving hundreds of families in need every year.

This mission would not be possible without our dedicated volunteers, and we are always happy and eager to welcome new people to the team. If you have thought about volunteering but are hesitant, consider:

- 1. The volunteer schedule is very flexible
- 2. Volunteers are never asked to vet clients (this is handled by CCHASM)
- 3. You will always work with a partner

RISC Update

Our Richmonders Involved to Strengthen our Community (RISC) Justice Ministry is kicking off this month! Our Team Leaders, Shelley Murray, Jan Belote, and Rich Kowalski will be hosting house meetings to hear about the issues are weighing on your hearts and get inspired to do some justice this year! Past RISC participants should expect to hear from our Team Leaders with an invitation to one of the house meetings. In the meantime, here are two quick updates on our work in 2021!

Affordable Housing-Thanks to the amazing persistence of RISC in the face of a lot of adversity, the city council will be voting in the next few weeks to increase the amount of funding to the Affordable Housing Trust Fund (AHTF) this year from \$3 million dollars to \$10 million dollars. We did it! These funds go to support homeless services and development of low-income housing in the Richmond area. This win, combined with our victory in early 2021 that secured a future dedicated stream of funding for the AHTF, should keep the funding level at \$10 million going forward. The Affordable Housing Trust Fund Board is eager to get to work and put us on a much better track to addressing housing insecurity in the Richmond metro area.

Gun Violence- Our Gun Violence team has done a huge amount of research in the past two years since voting to commit to this issue. We have met repeatedly with the Police Chief to discuss proven, data driven strategies to support police and communities in the fight to reduce violence, but he has yet to take action. This issue is more urgent than ever as Richmond is seeing an alarming increase in violent crime. Every day we wait to implement proven strategies means more lives lost in our city.
